This order shall dispose of CRM-M-9640-2019, filed by
petitioner-Krishan Kumar and CRM-M-10534-2019, filed by petitioner-
Parveen under Section 439 of the Code of Criminal Procedure, 1973 for

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grant of regular bail in case FIR No.961 dated 02.11.2017, registered at Police Station City Hisar, under Sections 148, 149, 302 and 120-B of the Indian Penal Code and Section 25 of the Arms Act, 1959.

Notice of motion was issued in both these petitions. Learned State counsel appeared and contested these petitions.

I have heard learned counsel for the petitioners as well as learned State counsel and gone through the record.

From the record, I find that as per the allegations in the FIR, Radhey Sham and Ashoki shot dead Jai Singh alias Dholia. There are allegations that petitioner-Krishan Kumar caught hold of the deceased, whereas petitioner-Parveen is stated to be standing there. As per the FIR, the present petitioners are not stated to be armed with any weapon and no injury is attributed to them.

Petitioner-Krishan Kumar and petitioner-Parveen have been in custody since 18.10.2018 and 10.12.2017, respectively. They are not required for any investigation or interrogation purposes as they are in judicial custody. The trial of case may take a long time. No useful purpose will be served by keeping the petitioners in custody till the final disposal of the case.

Keeping in view the facts and circumstances of the present case; without discussing the facts in minute detail and without expressing any opinion on the merits of the case, both these criminal miscellaneous petitions are allowed and the petitioners are ordered to be released on bail subject to their furnishing personal bonds in the sum of

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₹50,000/- with one surety in the like amount each to the satisfaction of
the trial Court/Duty Magistrate.
