This application has been moved for placing on record the copy of MLR.

Criminal Misc. Application is allowed and the copy of MLR is taken on record.

CRM-M No.9403 of 2019

Learned counsel for the petitioner submits that the name of the petitioner was not mentioned in the FIR. No specific role has been attributed to him. The bail petition filed by the petitioner has been dismissed only on the ground that the recovery is to be effected. Learned counsel also submits that the allegations are there against main accused, namely, Lalit Kumar. Petitioner is ready to join investigation and nothing is to be recovered from him.

Notice of motion for 30.04.2019.

Meanwhile, the petitioner is directed to join investigation and in the event of his arrest, he shall be released on interim bail to the satisfaction of the Arresting Officer. He shall join the investigation as and

when required by the Arresting Officer. He shall also comply with the conditions as envisaged under Section 438(2) of the Code of Criminal Procedure, which are as under :-

(i)that the petitioner shall make himself available for interrogation before investigating officer as and when required;

(ii)that the petitioner shall not, directly or indirectly, make any inducement, threat or promise to any person acquainted with the facts of the case so as to dissuade him from disclosing such facts to the court or to any police officer;

(iii)that the petitioner shall not leave India without the prior permission of the Court.”

Learned counsel appearing for the State of Haryana, on instructions from ASI Roshan Lal, has submitted that the petitioner in this case has joined the investigation and he is not required for further custodial interrogation.

In view thereof, interim order dated 07.03.2019 passed by this Court is made absolute.

Accordingly, the present petition is allowed.
