Present petition has been filed under Section 438 of the Code of Criminal Procedure (for short 'Cr.P.C') for grant of pre arrest bail to the petitioners no.1 and 3 in case FIR No.0026 dated 02.02.2019, under Sections 306/34 of the Indian Penal Code, 1860 registered at Police Station Division No.7, Police Commissionerate, Ludhiana, District Ludhiana.

This Court passed the following order on 01.03.2019:-

“Learned counsel for the petitioners wishes to withdraw the present petition qua petitioner No.2- Dimple Kapoor at this stage.

Dismissed as withdrawn qua petitioner No.2.

Further contends that the co-accused namely, Darshna Kapoor and Alisha Kapoor in CRM-M-8000 of 2019 and CRM-M-9466 of 2019 have already been granted the concession of interim protection vide orders dated 25.02.2019 and 01.03.2019 respectively passed by this Court.

In the meanwhile, the petitioners No. 1 and 3 are

directed to join investigation before the Investigating Officer. In the event of their arrest, the Arresting Officer would admit them to interim bail till the next date of hearing on their furnishing adequate bail and surety bonds to his satisfaction. The petitioners are also directed to abide by all the conditions as envisaged under Section 438(2) Cr.P.C. ”

Learned State Counsel, on instructions from ASI Resham Singh has acknowledged that in terms of the previous order the petitioners no.1 and 3 have joined the investigation and their custodial interrogation is no longer required in this case.

In view of above, the interim order dated 01.03.2019 is made absolute, subject to the conditions as envisaged under Section 438(2) Cr.P.C. and the present petition stands disposed off.
