In the present writ petition, the grievance which is being raised by the petitioner is that he had filed a review petition against the order dated 28.03.2016 (Annexure P-1) by which penalty of compulsarily retirement was imposed upon him as well as the order dated 15/16.5.2017 (Annexure P-2) by which the appeal filed by the petitioner against the said order was dismissed.

Learned counsel for the petitioner states that the said review petition is maintainable under the Regulation 74 of FCI (Staff) Regulations, 1971 and, therefore, the respondents are under obligation to decide the review petition at the earliest.

In view of the above, without going into the merits of the case or expressing any opinion to the entitlement of the petitioner in respect of the relief claimed, the present writ petition is disposed of with a direction to the respondents to decide the said review petition, which is pending before the authorities by passing a speaking order within a period of three months from the date of receipt of certified copy of this order.

The writ petition stands disposed of.
