AVNEESH JHINGAN, J (Oral):

The present contempt petition has been filed pleading wilful disobedience of order dated 20.11.2018 passed by this Court in CWP No.14039 of 2018.

The operational part of the order is reproduced below:-

“Let respondent No.5 implement the order passed by the Accountant General, Punjab dated 12.09.2018 fixing the retiral benefits as well as pension in case of petitioner Nirmal Singh. Let the payment in respect of order passed by the Accountant General, Punjab dated 12.09.2018 be made to the petitioner within a period of three months.”

Respondent has filed reply by way of affidavit of Avtar Singh, District Treasury Officer, Fatehgarh Sahib.

The relevant portion of the order is reproduced below:-

“3. That with reference to the letter No.152-154 dated 23.04.2019, the deponent had again written to Chief Manager, State Bank of India, Sirhind City, District Fatehgarh Sahib to provide the information/status of pension and retiral benefits to the petitioner.”

In view of reply filed, no cause of action survives for pursuing the contempt petition.

Learned counsel for the petitioner states that there is error in calculation of pension, liberty be granted to raise the issue with the respondent in accordance with law.

The contempt petition is disposed of as infructuous, with liberty as prayed for.

The rule issued against the respondent is discharged.
