ANIL KSHETARPAL, J.

This order shall dispose of two petitions bearing CRM-M No.18383 of 2018 and CRM-M No.22131 of 2018, having arisen out of same FIR.

In the case of Gautam Kumar (CRM-M-18383-2018), it has been contended by learned counsel for the petitioner that there is no recovery from the petitioner, whereas in the case of Judge Singh (CRM-M-22131-2018) recovery is only 250 gms of opium which is in the category of non-commercial.

Learned counsel for the State, on instructions from Dilbagh Singh, submits that the petitioners are in custody since 16.03.2018 and they

are not involved in any other case. He further submits that challan has been presented and charges have been framed.

Without commenting on the merits of the case and keeping in view the facts mentioned above, coupled with the fact that trial of the case is likely to take time, it is considered appropriate to release the petitioners on regular bail on their furnishing bail bonds/surety bonds to the satisfaction of the trial Court/Duty Magistrate, Ferozepur.

Both these petitions are allowed.
