The petitioner has filed this petition under Section 438 Cr.P.C. for grant of anticipatory bail in case FIR No.301 dated 02.11.2018 registered for the offence under Section 22 of the NDPS Act at Police Station Patran, Patiala.

I have heard learned counsel for the petitioner and have gone through the record.

As per the prosecution version, a secret information was received against the present petitioner and then the Naka was laid. The petitioner was found coming on motorcycle. As per the prosecution version, when the petitioner tried to abscond, he fell down and after leaving the motorcycle at spot, he absconded. He was duly identified by ASI Tejinder Pal Singh. 265 grams of heroin was recovered from the motorcycle. The alleged recovery falls in commercial quantity. Section 37 of the NDPS Act bars the grant of bail and otherwise, the petitioner is required for custodial interrogation, I do not find it a fit case where the petitioner is entitled to the benefit of anticipatory bail.

Therefore, finding no merit in the present petition, the same is dismissed.
