Report dated 02.05.2019 of learned Judicial Magistrate 1st

Class, Hoshiarpur has been received whereby after recording statements of complainant Priya and the accused namely Ashwani Kumar, the Court has shown its satisfaction that the compromise has been arrived at voluntarily, out of free will of the parties, without any undue influence, coercion or pressure.

Moreover, during the course of interaction with the parties, they have shown their resolve to end the dispute and have made statements that they have compromised the matter as per compromise (Annexure P2) dated 23.02.2019 and shall abide by the same.

Heard.

In the light of the satisfaction shown by the Court and the fact that the offence for which the accused has been hauled up is not of serious nature, together with the fact that compromise will go a long way in ironing out differences for betterment of future life of the parties and in view of the law laid down in '**Gian Singh v. State of Punjab and another**' 2012(4) RCR (Criminal) 543 and '**Kulwinder Singh and others v. State of Punjab and another**' 2007 (3) RCR (Criminal) 1052, the prayer made in the petition is allowed, proceedings by way of FIR No.19 dated 16.01.2019 under Section 354-A IPC pertaining to Police Station Model Town, Hoshiarpur and all consequences arising out of the said FIR qua the petitioner are quashed.

The petition stands disposed off in those terms.
