AVNEESH JHINGAN, J (Oral):

The present contempt petition has been filed pleading wilful disobedience of order dated 16.03.2018 passed by this Court in CWP No.28940 of 2017.

The operational part of the order is reproduced below:-

"3. Without expressing any opinion on the merits of the case, instant petition is disposed of with a direction to respondents to look into the grievances unfolded by the petitioner in the legal notice dated 10.07.2017 (P-3) in accordance with law, rules and regulations, within a period of four months from the date of receipt of certified copy of this order.

4. However, in case the petitioner feels dissatisfied by

any inaction of the authorities concerned, he shall be at liberty to have recourse to the other remedies available under law, including to approach this Court.”

Learned counsel for the respondents has produced order dated 12.07.2019 today in the Court, same is taken on record. Copy of order is handed over to learned counsel for the petitioner.

In view of order passed by the respondent, learned counsel for the petitioner states that no cause of action survives.

The contempt petition is disposed of as infructuous.

It is clarified that vide order dated 16.03.2018 passed by this Court, the petitioner has already been granted liberty to avail remedies under law, if aggrieved of order passed by the respondents.

The rule issued against the respondents is discharged.
