Report dated 07.08.2018 of learned Judicial Magistrate 1st

Class, Chandigarh has been received whereby after recording statements of complainant Sheela and the accused namely Rajesh Kumar, the Court has shown its satisfaction that the compromise has been arrived at voluntarily, out of free will of the parties, without any undue influence, coercion or pressure.

Moreover, during the course of interaction with the parties, they have shown their resolve to end the dispute and have made statements that they have compromised the matter as per compromise (Annexure P2) dated 02.03.2017 and shall abide by the same.

Heard.

In the light of the satisfaction shown by the Court and the fact that the dispute between the parties being a pure matrimonial and the offences for which the accused has been hauled up are not of serious nature, together with the fact that compromise will go a long way in ironing out differences for betterment of future life of the parties and in view of the law laid down in '**Gian Singh v. State of Punjab and another**' 2012(4) RCR (Criminal) 543 and '**Kulwinder Singh and others v. State of Punjab and another**' 2007 (3) RCR (Criminal) 1052, the prayer made in the petition is allowed, proceedings by way of FIR No.05 dated 23.01.2017 under Section 406, 498-A IPC pertaining to Women Police Station, Sector 17, Chandigarh and all consequences arising out of the said FIR qua the petitioner are quashed.

The petition stands disposed off in those terms.
