GURVINDER SINGH GILL, J. (ORAL)

1. The petitioner has approached this Court seeking issuance of direction to respondents No.2 and 3 so as to protect his life and liberty and also of other members of his family.
2. Learned counsel for the petitioner has submitted that respondent No.4-Pandeep Kaur was married to petitioner's brother namely Jagtar Singh but the behaviour of respondent No.4 and her husband was not good towards father of the petitioner due to which petitioner's father disowned Jagtar Singh i.e. husband of respondent No.4 leading to annoyance of respondent No.4 and of her relatives who are arrayed as respondents No.5 to 9. Learned

counsel for the petitioner has submitted that the petitioner is serving in 14 Punjab Battalion, NCC, Nabha as Havildar and the said respondents in the absence of petitioner had forcibly entered into his house and had taken away some articles and when the petitioner's wife objected to the same, said respondents No.4 to 9 used filthy language and insulted her.

3. Having heard learned counsel for the petitioner, the petition is disposed of with a direction to respondent No.2-Senior Superintendent of Police, Tarn Taran to look into the matter and to dispose of representation (Annexure P-3) expeditiously and in case, the allegations made therein are found to be well-founded then necessary steps warranted under law be taken thereupon at the earliest.
4. A copy of this order along with copy of representation (Annexure P-2) be sent to respondent No.2- Senior Superintendent of Police, Tarn Taran so as to enable him to do the needful expeditiously.
