Petitioner Rani Kaur has filed this petition under Section 438 Cr.P.C. for grant of anticipatory bail in case FIR No.0009 dated 16.01.2019, registered at Police Station City-1, Sangrur, under Sections 22 and 29 of the NDPS Act, 1985.

Notice of motion was issued.

Learned State counsel has appeared on behalf of the respondent-State and contested this petition.

I have heard learned counsel for the petitioner as well as learned State counsel and have gone through the record.

As per the prosecution version, 500 tablets containing the salt Tramadol have been recovered from co-accused Maninder Singh @ Binder. The present petitioner is nominated on the basis of disclosure statement of the main accused that alleged tablets have been supplied to him by the present petitioner.

In pursuance of the interim order dated 27.03.2019, passed by

this Court, the petitioner has already joined the investigation. She is not required for custodial interrogation. Nothing is to be recovered from her. No useful purpose would be served by sending her to custody.

Keeping in view the facts and circumstances of the present case; without discussing the facts of the case in minute details and without expressing any opinion on the merits of the case, I find merit in this petition and the same is allowed. The order dated 27.03.2019, granting interim bail to the petitioner, is made absolute. However, the petitioner shall join the investigation as and when called upon to do so and shall abide by the conditions of Section 438 (2) Cr.P.C.
