Prayer in this petition filed under Section 439 Cr.P.C. is for grant of regular bail to the petitioner in case FIR No.05 dated 08.1.2019, under Sections 323, 365 and 307 read with Section 34 IPC, registered at Police Station "B" Division, Amritsar, District Amritsar, during pendency of the trial.

Learned counsel for the petitioner contends that no case under Section 307 IPC is made out as the injuries allegedly caused are simple in nature. He further contends that the co-accused of the petitioner, namely, Amardeep Singh @ Raja is owner of BMK Hotel, where the complainant was employed earlier and later on the complainant joined the services in

Angad Hotel, who has falsely implicated the petitioner. It is pointed out that the vehicle allegedly used in the crime has already been recovered by the police. It is contended that petitioner happens to be friend of Amandeep Singh, with whom complainant has business rivalry.

On the other hand, learned State counsel, assisted by ASI Baljit Singh opposed the bail application. It is not in dispute that the MLR of the injured mentioning the injuries, suffered by the complainant, are simple and none of the injuries is dangerous to life.

At this stage, learned counsel for the petitioner has contended that the allegations are only regarding beatings and no weapon was used in the alleged crime and the petitioner is no more required for any investigation. Learned State counsel on instructions from ASI Baljit Singh states that qua petitioner the investigation is complete.

Considering the nature of offence, injuries and status of the case, further detention of the petitioner is not justified. Without commenting anything upon merits of the case, it is ordered that petitioner, namely, Ranjodh Singh be released on regular bail subject to his furnishing the requisite bail bonds and surety bonds to the satisfaction of the trial Court.

The petition is allowed.
