By filing the present petition under Section 438 of the Code of Criminal Procedure, the petitioner has sought anticipatory bail in FIR No.86 dated 29.04.2017 registered under Sections 307, 324 and 323 read with Section 34 of Indian Penal Code (Section 307 IPC deleted and Section 336 IPC added later on) and Sections 25 and 27 of Arms Act registered at Police Station Sadar Ferozepur, District Ferozepur.

On 30.11.2018 this Court had passed the following order:-

“Learned counsel for the petitioner submits that the co-accused of the petitioner has already been granted the concession of anticipatory bail by this Court in CRM-M-19489-2018.

Adjourned to 04.02.2019.

In the meanwhile, petitioner shall join the investigation and would come present as and when called for and in the event of arrest, he shall be admitted to interim bail on his furnishing personal and surety bonds to the

satisfaction of the Arresting/Investigating Officer. The petitioner shall also abide by the conditions as specified under Section 438 (2) Cr.P.C.”

Learned counsel for the petitioner contends that in pursuance of the order dated 30.11.2018, the petitioner has joined the investigation.

Learned State counsel on instructions from HC Paramjit Singh submits that the petitioner has joined the investigation and he is not required for custodial interrogation.

In view of the above, the interim bail granted by this Court vide order dated 30.11.2018, is made absolute.

The petition stands allowed.
