By these petitions, the petitioners seek anticipatory bail on FIR No.29 dated 29.03.2018 having been registered against them at Police Station Cantt., Bathinda, for the alleged commission of offences punishable under Sections 420 and 120-B of IPC.

The dispute between the parties having been sent to Mediation & Conciliation Centre of this Court, the report of the learned Mediator in the Mediation & Conciliation Centre, is to the effect that the parties have actually reached an amicable settlement as per the compromise/settlement deed annexed with that report.

However, Mr. Phoolka, learned counsel appearing for the complainant, submits that in case there is any breach of the compromise, the complainant may be granted liberty to file an appropriate application.

That being so, with Mr.Phoolka, learned counsel for the complainant also otherwise not denying the aforesaid settlement, these petitions stand disposed of with the order dated 28.05.2018, granting interim bail to the petitioner in CRM-M-22776-2018, as also with the order dated 26.07.2018 granting interim bail to the petitioner in CRM-M-25761-2018, made absolute, subject to the petitioners complying with all terms and conditions of the compromise, as has been submitted by Mr. Phoolka.

A copy of this order be placed on the file of the other connected matter too.
