FATEH DEEP SINGH, J. (ORAL)

Report dated 26.09.2018 of learned Judicial Magistrate 1st

Class, Gurugram has been received whereby after recording statements of complainant Priyanka Yadav and the accused namely Sandeep Yadav, the Court has shown its satisfaction that the compromise has been arrived at voluntarily, out of free will of the parties, without any undue influence, coercion or pressure.

Moreover, during the course of interaction with the petitioner, he has shown his resolve to end the dispute and has made statements that he has compromised the matter as per settlement (Annexure P2) dated 23.03.2018 and shall abide by the same. A perusal

of the records further reveals that nothing is due towards anyone on account of this settlement.

Heard.

In the light of the satisfaction shown by the Court and the fact that the dispute between the parties being a pure matrimonial and the offences for which the accused has been hauled up are not of serious nature, together with the fact that compromise will go a long way in ironing out differences for betterment of future life of the parties and in view of the law laid down in '**Gian Singh v. State of Punjab and another**' 2012(4) RCR (Criminal) 543 and '**Kulwinder Singh and others v. State of Punjab and another**' 2007 (3) RCR (Criminal) 1052, the prayer made in the petition is allowed, proceedings by way of FIR No.163 dated 12.08.2016 under Sections 323, 406, 498-A, 506 IPC pertaining to Women Police Station Gurugram and all consequences arising out of the said FIR qua the petitioner are quashed.

The petition stands disposed off in those terms.
