AJAY TEWARI, J. (Oral)

This is a petition for grant of anticipatory bail to the petitioners under Section 438 Cr.P.C. in case FIR No.26 dated 24.05.2017 registered under Sections 406/498-A IPC at Police Station Women Cell, Bathinda, Punjab.

This petition has arisen out of the matrimonial dispute of the son of the petitioner No.1 Arun Goyal with Leezu Singla. Both the parties are present in Court and are identified by their counsels.

With the intervention of the learned counsel, this dispute has been settled. It has been agreed that the petitioners shall pay a sum of

claims of the complainant including wedding expenses, permanent alimony and *stridhan*. It is stated that whatever was got recovered from the petitioners (and which is lying in the custody of the police) will be returned to the petitioners. It is stated that the laptop, blank cheques and the educational certificates of the complainant are lying in the custody of the police. The police will return the same to the complainant. It is stated that the petitioners shall pay half the amount i.e. Rs.41.00 lakhs to the complainant by way of draft on 10.06.2019 in the chamber of Mr. Jai Gopal Goel, Advocate at Bathinda.

On that date the parties will file a petition for divorce by mutual consent and the petitioners will hand over the draft of the remaining amount of Rs.41.00 lakhs to the complainant on the date fixed for 2nd motion. It is further agreed that the decree of divorce would be the evidence of the fact of this compromise and the petitioners and the other accused would be entitled to file a petition for quashing of this FIR on the basis of this compromise and the complainant party will cooperate with them. The parties have further agreed that within one month of the decree of divorce all the cases filed by them against each other will be withdrawn. The direction regarding payment of maintenance under the Domestic Violence Act, 2005 would be in abeyance till such time as the divorce proceedings are pending.

In view of this compromise, the interim bail granted to the petitioners is confirmed.

Petition stands allowed.

Since the main case has been decided, the pending criminal miscellaneous application, if any, also stands disposed of.
