Petitioner Sachin has filed this second petition under Section 439 of the Code of Criminal Procedure, 1973 for grant of regular bail in case FIR No.161 dated 11.06.2017, registered at Police Station Adampur City, Hisar, under Sections 307, 332, 353, 186 and 34 of the Indian Penal Code and Section 25 of the Arms Act, 1959.

Notice of motion has been issued.

Learned State counsel appeared and contested the instant petition.

I have heard learned counsel for the petitioner as well as learned State counsel and gone through the record.

As per the prosecution version, the FIR was registered on the basis of secret information against the present petitioner etc. When the police party raided the place, the present petitioner along with one co-accused was apprehended. Another co-accused fled away from the spot and when Constable Anil followed to catch him, he caused injuries to the

Constable Anil with knife. The present petitioner is stated to be armed with 32 bore illegal pistol, but no injury has been attributed to him nor he has used the weapon.

The petitioner has been in custody since 11.06.2017. He is not required for any investigation or interrogation purposes as he is in judicial custody. The trial of the case may take long time. No useful purpose will be served by keeping him in custody till the final disposal of the case.

Keeping in view the facts and circumstances of the present case; without discussing the facts in minute detail and without expressing any opinion on the merits of the case, this criminal miscellaneous petition is allowed and the petitioner is ordered to be released on bail subject to his furnishing personal bonds in the sum of ₹50,000/- with one surety in the like amount to the satisfaction of the trial Court/Duty Magistrate.
