As per order dated 19.07.2019, Executive Officer, Municipal Council, Kotakpura had made a statement that delay in reimbursing the principal amount would be compensated by paying 6% interest to the petitioners w.e.f January 2019 till actual date of payment and the interest paid shall be recovered from the defaulting officer/official.

Learned counsel for respondent No.3 states that though Sh. Amrik Singh, Executive Officer, has been transferred and his affidavit could not be filed but it has been agreed that 6% interest from January 2019 to till the payment would be paid to the petitioner and the same shall be recovered from the defaulting officer/official. He further states that payment of principal amount has been made and in case it has not been made, the same would be made within three weeks and the payment of interest would be made within six weeks from today and the recovery part would be done thereafter.

In view of above, the contempt petitions are disposed of. However, the compliance report with regard to the recovery to be made from defaulting official shall be placed on record within four weeks.

Rule is discharged.
