This application is for addition of Section 201 IPC in the head note as well as in the main petition.

Learned counsel for the petitioner contends that during the pendency of this petition, Section 201 was added in the FIR, therefore, it could not be mentioned in the petition.

Notice in the application.

At the asking of the Court, Ms. Sudipti Sharma, Addl. AG, Punjab accepts notice on behalf of the State.

For the reasons stated in the application, the same is allowed and Section 201 IPC shall be read in the main petition as well as in the prayer clause.

Registry is directed to carry out necessary correction.

Main Case.

The petitioner is seeking anticipatory bail in FIR No.203 dated 06.09.2018, under Sections 323, 324, 452 and 34 of the Indian Penal Code ('IPC' - for short) and SectionS 326 and 201 IPC (added later on) , registered at Police Station City, District Gurdaspur.

Learned counsel for the petitioner contends that the petitioner is alleged to have caused injuries on the non-vital parts of the body of the complainant.

A coordinate Bench of this Court, by the order dated 20.03.2019, had directed the petitioner to appear before the Investigating Officer and join the investigation and in the event of his arrest, he was ordered to be released on ad-interim bail to the satisfaction of the Investigating/Arresting Officer, subject to the conditions envisaged under Section 438(2) Cr.P.C.

Learned State counsel, on instructions from ASI Jagjit Singh, states that the petitioner has joined investigation and is not required for custodial interrogation.

In view of the submissions of learned counsel for the petitioner and keeping in view the fact that the petitioner has joined investigation, the order dated 20.03.2019 granting interim bail to the petitioner is made absolute.

However, the petitioner shall abide by the conditions stipulated under Section 438(2) Cr.P.C. He shall also join investigation as and when called upon to do so.

The petition stands disposed of.
