The learned State counsel, on instructions from ASI Gurmel Singh states that offence under Section 377 of the Indian Penal Code stands deleted and has placed on record the attested copy of the DDR.

Report dated 18.04.2019 of the learned Sub Divisional

Judicial Magistrate, Talwandi Sabo, has been received whereby after recording statements of respondent No.2-Rashmi and accused/petitioners, namely, Vikramjeet Singh, Joginder Singh and Manjit Kaur, the Court has shown its satisfaction that the compromise has been arrived at voluntarily, out of their own free will, without any undue influence, coercion or pressure.

Moreover, during the course of interaction with the parties, they have shown their resolve to end the dispute and have made statements that they have compromised the matter as per Annexure P-3 and shall abide by the same.

Heard.

In the light of the satisfaction shown by the Court and the fact that the dispute between the parties being a pure matrimonial and the offence for which the accused have been hauled up are not of serious nature as offence under Section 377 of the Indian Penal Code stands deleted together with the fact that compromise will go a long way in ironing out differences for betterment of future life of the parties and in view of the law laid down in '**Gian Singh Vs. State of Punjab and another**' 2012 (4) RCR (Criminal) 543 and '**Kulwinder Singh and others Vs. State of Punjab and another**' 2007 (3) RCR (Criminal) 1052, the prayer made in the petition is allowed, proceedings by way of FIR No.0246 dated 05.10.208 registered at Police Station Raman District Bathinda, under Sections 498-A and 506 of IPC and Section 66(E) of the Information

Technology Act and all consequences arising out of the said FIR *qua* the petitioners are quashed.

The petition stands allowed in those terms.
