The petitioner has filed present petition under Section 407 Cr.PC seeking transfer of investigation of FIR No.16 dated 21.12.2018 under Sections 120-B, 323, 376, 406, 452, 467, 498-A, 506 and 511 IPC registered at Police Station Sector-6 Bahadurgarh, District Jhajjar to District Palwal.

Learned counsel for the petitioner states that the petitioner was married with Dharampal on 22.02.2007 and she has three children out of this marriage. Her husband and his relatives started taunting her for not bringing sufficient dowry, which led to registration of the present FIR.

After arguing for some time, learned counsel for the petitioner has confined his arguments for a fair investigation in the case as there is an apprehension that the husband of the petitioner is known to Mr. Ravi Kumar,

SHO, Incharge, Police Station Bahadurgarh and in this manner, she may not get a fair investigation in the case.

On asking of this Court, Ms. Mahima Yashpal, A.A.G., Haryana accepts notice on behalf of respondent-State.

Let requisite number of copies of paper book be given to learned State counsel during course of the day.

Since the present petition has been filed without making such representation to the concerned Superintendent of Police, it is directed that in case the petitioner submits a representation to the concerned Superintendent of Police seeking fair investigation in the FIR within a period of 15 days from today, undoubtedly, the concerned Superintendent of Police shall take note of the same and shall act in accordance with law.
