This is a petition for grant of anticipatory bail to the petitioner under Section 438 Cr.P.C. in case FIR No.36 dated 02.03.2019 registered under Sections 336/506/34 IPC and Sections 25/27 of Arms Act, 1959 at Police Station Chheharta, Police Commissionerate Amritsar, District Amritsar.

After arguing for sometime learned counsel for the petitioner states that ultimately this was a case where the only allegation was that the petitioner alongwith his co-accused had gone to the house of the complainant at 2.30 at night abused him and had fired in the air. As per him

the petitioner and the complainant are living in close vicinity to each other and the petitioner would not press this petition on merits but he may be given a short time to enable him to settle the dispute with the complainant in the interest of societal harmony.

Counsel for the complainant has argued that though what was done by the petitioner was not a small act yet if the petitioner is feeling genuinely remorseful and is ready to settle he would not oppose the grant of interim bail.

In the circumstances, this petition is disposed of with a direction that the petitioner shall appear before the Investigating Officer on 06.04.2019 at 10.00 am. The Investigating Officer shall give him interim bail subject to the conditions envisaged under Section 438(2) Cr.P.C. In case the petitioner is able to satisfy the concerns of the complainant and the complainant makes a statement to this effect before the Investigating Officer on or before 12.04.2019 the interim bail granted to the petitioner would be confirmed. If however the petitioner is not able to persuade the complainant about his intention and the complainant does not appear before the Investigating Officer the interim bail would be cancelled.

Petition stand disposed of with the above said observations.

Since the main case has been decided, the pending criminal miscellaneous application, if any, also stands disposed of.
