Report dated 24.08.2018 of learned Judicial Magistrate 1st

Class, Malout, District Sri Muktsar Sahib has been received whereby after recording statements of complainant Sohail Singh, his daughter Amritpal Kaur and the accused persons, namely Manmohan Singh, Shavinderjit Singh, Sharanjeet Kaur, Baljeet Kaur and Mandeep Kaur, the Court has shown its satisfaction that the compromise has been arrived at voluntarily, out of free will of the parties, without any undue influence, coercion or pressure.

A perusal of the record reveals that the parties have given final effect to their agreement settlement/compromise (Annexure P2) and that nothing is due towards anyone on account of this settlement and that the final effect can be given to this petition.

In the light of the satisfaction shown by the Court and the fact that the dispute between the parties being a pure matrimonial and the offenses for which the accused have been hauled up are not of serious nature, together with the fact that compromise will go a long way in ironing out differences for betterment of future life of the parties and in view of the law laid down in '**Gian Singh v. State of Punjab and another**' 2012(4) RCR (Criminal) 543 and '**Kulwinder Singh and others v. State of Punjab and another**' 2007 (3) RCR (Criminal) 1052, the prayer made in the petition is allowed, proceedings by way of FIR No.54 dated 17.06.2015 under Sections 498-A, 406 IPC pertaining to Police Station Kabarwala, District Shri Muktsar Sahib and all consequences arising out of the said FIR qua the petitioners are quashed.

The petition stands disposed off in those terms.
