1. Present writ petition has been filed by the petitioner claiming the re-fixation of his pay in view of the orders of this Court passed in CWP No.16084 of 1997, CWP No.13300 of 1990 and CWP No.13342 of 1990 which were upheld by the Hon'ble Supreme Court, vide order dated 08.12.2015 being Civil Appeal No.8661 of 2009.

2. Petitioner claims that he is similarly situated with those who have been granted the relief by this Court but the same has not been granted to him only on the ground that he has not approached this Court and was not a party in above mentioned writ petitions.

3. Counsel for the petitioner states that for the relief which has been claimed in the present writ petition, the petitioner has served the respondents with a legal notice dated 12.01.2019 (Annexure P-3) and the petitioner will be satisfied, at this stage, in case, a time bound direction is issued to the respondents to decide the legal notice dated 12.01.2019 (Annexure P-3) by passing an appropriate speaking order.

4. Keeping in view the request made by counsel for the petitioner and without expressing any opinion on the merits of the case and entitlement of the petitioner in respect of the claim made in the writ petition/legal notice, the respondents are directed to decide the legal notice dated 12.01.2019 (Annexure P-3) within a period of three months from the date of receipt of a certified copy of this order. In case it is found that the petitioner is entitled for any relief, the same shall also be released to him within a period of next three months.

5. Present writ petition stands disposed of.
