JASWANT SINGH, J. (ORAL)

Petitioner (*Nettar Singh*) is a resident of Village Bolri, Block Sanaur, Tehsil and District Patiala. His grievance is that inspite of eviction of private respondent Nos. 5 to 13, vide eviction order dated 05.04.2016 (**Annexure P-1**), from the land measuring 10 kanals 12 marlas shown as ***gair mumkin school and ground***, no efforts have been made to restore the possession back to the Panchayat.

Upon notice to the official respondent Nos. 1 to 4 only, learned State Counsel on instructions from Ms. Neeru Garg, BDPO, Sanaur, states that on the earlier efforts for executing the warrants of possession, a law and order problem had erupted. She further states that police help would be required for execution of the eviction orders and prays for two months' time in view of the engagement of the official(s) in the election process.

In view of the stand of the State for executing the eviction orders, if legally permissible, within next two months from today, no further orders are required to be passed in the present writ petition and the same has become infructuous.

Disposed of as infructuous.

The petitioner, however, is at liberty to seek revival of the present writ petition in case the eviction orders, if legally permissible, are not executed within the said time.
