Prayer in this petition filed under Section 482 Cr.P.C. is for quashing of FIR No.202 dated 08.06.2016 under Sections 323, 406 and 498-A IPC registered at Police Station Pundri, District Kaithal and all subsequent proceedings arising therefrom on the basis of compromise dated 18.03.2017 entered into between the parties.

Learned counsel for respondent No.2, on instructions from his client, who is present in Court, states that the matter has not been compromised between the parties. Even petitioner No.3 has not paid a sum of Rs.5,000/- to respondent No.2-complainant, as directed by this Court vide order dated 01.02.2019.

The case was listed for hearing on 27.05.2019, but since no one was present on behalf of the petitioners, the same was adjourned for today. Even today, no one has put in appearance on behalf of the petitioners. Therefore, for the reason that respondent No.2-complainant has not supported the compromise arrived at between the parties and no one has put in appearance on behalf of the petitioners coupled with the fact that petitioner No.3 has not paid the amount of Rs.5,000/- to respondent No.2, the present petition is dismissed for non-prosecution.

However, it is made clear that in case a fresh compromise is arrived at between the parties, the petitioners shall be at liberty to file a fresh petition seeking quashing of the aforementioned FIR on the basis of that compromise.
