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**ARUN MONGA, J**

1. Assailed herein is an order dated 18.03.2019 (Annexure P-1) by virtue of which the petitioner, working as Pharmacist with the respondents, has been transferred from Hisar to Suratgarh(Rajasthan) purportedly on periodical policy ground.

2. The stand of the petitioner is that he has been having serving the respondents since 1995 without any complaint and all of a sudden, he has been transferred to Suratgarh in violation of the periodical transfer policy.

3. I have heard learned counsel for the parties and have gone through the paper-book carefully.

4. Learned counsel for the petitioner placed reliance on information, Annexure P-3 to point out that from 2005 to 2016 there was no transfer of Pharmacist on periodical ground. He further argued that in the transfer policy, Annexure P-2, post of Pharmacist has not been mentioned as sensitive and therefore, petitioner cannot be transferred. There is no substance in this plea raised by the petitioner. A transfer is an exigency of service and cannot be questioned as a matter of right. Unless and until

some *malafide* has been shown on the part of authorities while making the transfers, the Courts should be cautious enough and refrain from to interfering in the administrative matters. No ill-intention of authorities in passing the impugned transfer order has been alleged. No interference is thus, called for.

Dismissed in limine.
