FATEH DEEP SINGH, J. (Oral)

Report dated 30.07.2018 of the learned Judicial Magistrate 1st Class has been received whereby after recording statements of respondent Jaspreet Kaur and accused/petitioner Mandeep Singh, Sanjiv Kumar and Balveer Kaur, the Court has shown its satisfaction that the compromise has been arrived at voluntarily, out of their own free will, without any undue influence, coercion or pressure. The trial Court has further reported that though accused Gurdev Singh has been arrayed as one of the accused in the FIR at the instance of the complainant, however, during the pendency of the appeal, he has died and death certificate to that effect is on the judicial file as Ex.C4.

Moreover, the private parties to this petition have put in

appearance before this Court and during the course of interaction with the parties, it transpired that they have compromised the matter and resolved to end the dispute and compromised the matter as per compromise/affidavit (Annexure P-2) and shall abide by the same.

Heard.

In the light of statements made by the parties and the fact that the dispute between the parties being a pure matrimonial and the offence for which the accused have been hauled up are not of serious nature, together with the fact that compromise will go a long way in ironing out differences for betterment of future life of the parties and in view of the law laid down in '**Gian Singh Vs. State of Punjab and another**' 2012 (4) RCR (Criminal) 543 and '**Kulwinder Singh and others Vs. State of Punjab and another**' 2007 (3) RCR (Criminal) 1052, the prayer made in the petition is allowed, proceedings by way of FIR No. 58 dated 25.03.2017 registered at Police Station Bigla, Tehsil Phillaur, District Jalandhar under Sections 406, 498-A, 323 and 34 IPC and all consequences arising out of the said FIR qua the petitioners are quashed.

The petition stands allowed in those terms.
