As already recorded in the order dated 22.8.2019, the reports of the learned Judicial Magistrate Ist Class, Moga, have been received, stating to the effect that the matter has been amicably compromised between the parties, with the complainant in the FIR, i.e. Major Singh, as also the complainant in the complaint case, i.e. Bikkar Singh, having recorded their statements to that effect.

Today, learned State counsel, on instructions, submits that there is no other criminal case found to be registered against the petitioners in either of these two cases.

That being so and the matter having been amicably compromised between the parties, looking at the nature of the offences, though even an offence under Section 326 of the IPC is alleged to have been committed by the petitioners, yet in the interest of peace and harmony in the community, these petitions are allowed; and FIR no.132 dated 26.9.2012 (in CRM-M-29710 of 2017) and Complaint RBT no.17 dated 24.1.2013 (in CRM-M-29730 of 2017), along with all subsequent proceedings arising therefrom, are hereby quashed.
