Petitioner-Daljit Singh prays for grant of regular bail in FIR No.40 dated 27.02.2019 registered under Sections 307, 506, 148, 149 of the Indian Penal Code (Act No.45 of 1860) and Section 25 of the Arms Act (Act No.54 of 1959) at Police Station Sidhwan Bet, District Ludhiana Rural.

Learned counsel for the petitioner submits that the petitioner is not alleged to be armed and he has been referred to as one of the person who was accompanying the main accused i.e. Kuldeep Singh. He has further submitted that no injury is attributed to the petitioner.

Learned counsel for the complainant has submitted that he has no objection to the releasing of the petitioner on bail.

Learned counsel for the State has submitted that the

investigation is not yet complete and, therefore, the petitioner should not be released on bail.

It is apparent that the petitioner-accused and the complainant have resolved their dispute. Still further, as rightly contended by the learned counsel, no specific injury or role has been attributed to the petitioner. Petitioner is in custody since 08.03.2019 i.e. for almost 2 months.

Without commenting on the merits of the case and keeping in view the fact that the petitioner is in custody since 08.03.2019 and the trial of the case is likely to take a long time, the petitioner is directed to be released on bail on his furnishing bail bonds/surety bonds to the satisfaction of the Illaqa Magistrate/Duty Magistrate, Ludhiana.

Accordingly, the present petition is allowed.
