G.S. SANDHAWALIA, J. (Oral) :

Prayer has been made to pay arrears of deduction and also the retiral benefits of the petitioner and to decide the representation/legal notice dated 28.11.2018 (Annexure P-1)

A perusal of the legal notice would go on to show that the petitioner had served from 17.3.1980 upto 1992 as a Messenger with the respondent Bank. His services were terminated on account of absence. The order of termination has not been challenged for all these 27 long years.

During the stage of arguments, the Court is informed that qualifying service for the purpose of pension, would be 20 years and as per the fact itself, the petitioner does not have requisite number of years of service.

In such circumstances, the writ petition is based on no legal right for issuance of any directions and is also barred on account of delay and laches. It is settled principle that jurisdiction of the Writ Court is extraordinary and the present case is not fit case to exercise its jurisdiction.

Therefore, the present writ petition is dismissed in limine.
