Petitioners Rajwinder Kaur and Sukhdarshan Singh have filed the present petition for grant of protection as they apprehend threat at the hands of respondents No.4 and 5 (parents of petitioner No.1).

Learned counsel for the petitioners contends that the the petitioners entered into marriage on 02.4.2019 and the girl left her parental house on the same day. According to him, a representation dated 02.4.2019 was submitted before the Senior Superintendent of Police, Sangrur, wherein it was mentioned that after marriage, petitioner No.1 had called her father intimating about this marriage and sought his consent, whereupon, her father extended threat.

Learned counsel for the petitioners does not dispute the love

affair between petitioners No.1 and 2 was two years old and during this period, the girl continued to stay with her parents. According to him the love affair was also opposed by the parents during the said period. Apparently, at that time, petitioner No.1 despite opposition of the parents never apprehended any threat.

The pleadings as contained in the petition do not inspire confidence, therefore, no ground is made out to exercise inherent powers under Section 482 Cr.P.C.

Dismissed.
