The present contempt petition has been filed alleging wilful disobedience of the order dated 24.7.2018 passed by this Court in CWP No. 17996 of 2018. The operative part of the said order is reproduced below:

“Instant petition is disposed of with a direction to respondent No. 2- Deputy Commissioner, Mini Secretariat, Ludhiana to look into the grievances unfolded by the petitioner in the legal notice dated 20.1.2018 (P-11) and to take a conscious decision by passing a speaking order, within a period of two months from the date of receipt of a certified copy of this order.”

Reply by way of affidavit of Pardeep Kumar Agrawal, Deputy Commissioner, Ludhiana filed in court today is taken on record. Along with reply, order (Annexure R4) has been annexed.

Learned counsel for the State, on instructions from Gurpreet Singh, Clerk in the office of Deputy Commissioner, Ludhiana, states that the delay occurred in deciding the legal notice was unintentional as the service book of the petitioner was not complete since 1992, it took time to do the needful. He further states that the case of the petitioner has already been forwarded to the Accountant General, Punjab.

Learned counsel for the petitioner states that after passing of the order by the respondent, if any grievance is there that would be raised as per the liberty granted by this Court vide order dated 24.7.2018.

Disposed of as infructuous.
