Report dated 16.05.2019 of learned Chief Judicial Magistrate Ludhiana has been received whereby after recording statements of petitioners Jyoti Chakrawarti, Shekhar Chakrawarti, Sewak, Amar and Jangir Singh, complainant Gurdeep Singh and eye witnesses/injured Sharanjit Singh and Paramjeet Kaur, the Court has shown its satisfaction that the compromise has been arrived at voluntarily, out of free will of the parties, without any undue influence, coercion or pressure.

Heard.

In the light of the satisfaction shown by the Court and the fact that the offences for which the accused have been hauled up are not of serious nature, together with the fact that compromise will go a long way in ironing out differences for betterment of future life of the parties and in view of the law laid down in '**Gian Singh Vs. State of Punjab and another**' **2012 (4) RCR (Criminal) 543** and '**Kulwinder Singh and others Vs. State of Punjab and another**' **2007 (3) RCR (Criminal) 1052**, the prayer made in the petition is allowed, proceedings by way of FIR No. 391 dated 27.10.2017 registered at Police Station Focal Point, Ludhiana, District Ludhiana under Sections 323, 341, 148, 149, 451, 354 and 506 IPC and all consequences arising out of the said FIR qua the petitioners are quashed.

The petition stands allowed in those terms.
