The petitioners are seeking anticipatory bail in FIR No.0019 dated 14.01.2019 under Sections 148, 149, 323, 324, 506 and 307 of the Indian Penal Code ('IPC' - for short) and Section 25/54/59 of the Arms Act registered at Police Station Kharkhoda, District Sonapat.

Learned counsel for the petitioners contends that the petitioners had earlier been granted regular bail by the trial Court and subsequently on the basis of opinion of the doctor on 15.03.2009, the injury on the person of injured Ashok which is a lacerated wound of 5 x 1 cm on parietal region was declared as dangerous to life and Section 307 IPC was added. He also contends that the FIR in the present case is the outcome of a family dispute with regard to partition of land. Petitioner No.1 is the uncle of the complainant. He also contends that the petitioners shall make every endeavour to settle the matter finally with the complainant so that they can live peacefully.

This Court, by the order dated 29.04.2019, had directed the petitioners to appear before the Investigating Officer and join the investigation and in the event of their arrest, they were to be released on ad-interim bail to the satisfaction of the Investigating/Arresting Officer, subject to the conditions envisaged under Section 438(2) Cr.P.C.

Learned State counsel, upon instructions from SI Surender Singh, states that the petitioners have joined investigation and are not required for custodial interrogation.

In view of the submissions of learned counsel for the petitioners and keeping in view the fact that the petitioners have joined investigation, the order dated 29.04.2019 granting interim bail to the petitioners is made absolute.

However, the petitioners shall abide by the conditions stipulated under Section 438(2) Cr.P.C. They shall also join investigation as and when called upon to do so.

The petition stands disposed of.
