The petitioner is seeking anticipatory bail in FIR No.14 dated 11.01.2019 under Sections 420 and 120-B of the Indian Penal Code registered at Police Station City Khanna, District Ludhiana.

Learned counsel for the petitioner contends that the allegations against the petitioner in the FIR are that the complainant had purchased a plot from Jagjit Kaur for a total sale consideration of ₹3,40,000/- although there was previous litigation with regard to same plot as Jagjit Kaur had entered into an agreement to sell with another person. The allegations against the petitioner are that he had introduced Jagjit Kaur to the complainant. He also contends that there is no allegation that the petitioner had accepted any money or had even appended his signatures to the sale-deed as an attesting witness. He further contends that the petitioner is not involved in any other case.

This Court, by the order dated 11.04.2019, had directed the petitioner to appear before the Investigating Officer and join the investigation and in the event of his arrest, he was ordered to be released

on ad-interim bail to the satisfaction of the Investigating/Arresting

Officer, subject to the conditions envisaged under Section 438(2) Cr.P.C.

Learned counsel for the petitioner contends that the petitioner has joined investigation.

Learned State counsel, on instructions from ASI -Swaarajdin, states that the petitioner has joined investigation and he is not required for custodial interrogation.

In view of the submissions of learned counsel for the petitioner especially when the petitioner has joined investigation, the order dated 11.04.2019 granting interim bail to the petitioner is made absolute.

However, the petitioner shall abide by the conditions stipulated under Section 438(2) Cr.P.C. He shall also join investigation as and when called upon to do so.

The petition stands disposed of.
