Petitioner Rajesh has filed this petition under Section 438 Cr.P.C. for grant of anticipatory bail in case FIR No.148 dated 22.07.2014, registered at Police Station Alewa, District Jind, under Sections 148, 149, 323, 324, 325, 326, 452 and 506 of the Indian Penal Code.

Notice of motion was issued.

Learned State counsel and counsel for the complainant have appeared and contested this petition.

I have heard learned counsel for the parties as well as learned State counsel and have gone through the record.

The present petitioner has been summoned under Section 319 Cr.P.C. by the trial Court. He is named in the FIR. He is stated to be armed with gandasa and the injury on the head of complainant Kelo Devi is attributed to him.

In compliance of order dated 12.04.2019, the petitioner has

already surrendered before the trial Court and has been released on interim bail. He is not required for any investigation or interrogation purpose as the trial is already going on. He is only to face the trial. No useful purpose would be served by sending him to custody.

Keeping in view the facts and circumstances of the present case; without discussing the facts of the case in minute details and without expressing any opinion on the merits of the case, I find merit in this petition and the same is allowed. The order dated 12.04.2019, granting interim bail to the petitioner, is made absolute.
