Prayer in this petition is for issuance of directions to the respondents for registration of an FIR under Sections 406, 420 and 120-B IPC.

As per allegations in the petition, the private respondents have received an amount of ₹ 2,40,000,00/- from the petitioner. Reply by way of an affidavit of Deputy Superintendent of Police, Sub Division Sangrur is already on record. As per the reply, an inquiry was conducted by SP Investigation Patiala and it was found that the dispute is regarding an agreement to sell and the occurrence has taken place in District Court Sangrur, so, a direction be issued to SHO Police Station City Sangrur to take the action. The inquiry was sent to Inspector General of Police, Zonal-I, Punjab to refer the same to SSP, Sangrur for further investigation by SP Investigation Patiala. Thereafter, the opinion of the Deputy D.A. (Legal) was taken, in which, it was found that both the parties are levelling allegations against each other as the agreement

to sell did not mature into a sale deed and there was a settlement that the vendor shall return the money. It is further stated that on the basis of the legal opinion, it is found that the case is of a civil nature and no further action by the police is required.

It is further stated that both the applications given by the petitioner have been filed.

In view of the same, no further action is called for. This petition is disposed of by granting liberty to the petitioner to file a complaint before the competent court of law, if so, advised.
