Class, Gurugram has been received whereby after recording statements of respondent No.2-Neha Kashyap @ Neha Kanojia and accused/petitioners, namely, Nishant Bhaskar and Chanda Devi, the Court has shown its satisfaction that the compromise has been arrived at voluntarily, out of their own free will, without any undue influence, coercion or pressure.

Moreover, during the course of interaction with the parties, complainant/respondent No.2-Neha Kashyap @ Neha Kanojia, who has been identified by her counsel, Mr. Veneet Chaudhary, Advocate, has made

statement that she has concluded a settlement with the petitioners and she has received the entire amount of her claim as full and final settlement and nothing is due and has no objection if the present FIR and all consequential proceedings arising therefrom, are hereby quashed. The same is acceded by the petitioners-Nishant Bhaskar and Chanda Devi, who have been identified by their counsel, Mr. Gaurav Tyagi, Advocate, in the statement before this Court.

Heard.

In the light of the satisfaction shown by the Court and the fact that the dispute between the parties being a pure matrimonial and the offence for which the accused have been hauled up are not of serious nature, together with the fact that compromise will go a long way in ironing out differences for betterment of future life of the parties and in view of the law laid down in '**Gian Singh Vs. State of Punjab and another**' 2012 (4) RCR (Criminal) 543 and '**Kulwinder Singh and others Vs. State of Punjab and another**' 2007 (3) RCR (Criminal) 1052, the prayer made in the petition is allowed, proceedings by way of FIR No. 627 dated 19.09.2015 registered at Police Station Sector 10, Gurugram under Sections 323/406/498-A/34 of the IPC, and all consequences arising out of the said FIR qua the petitioners are quashed.

The petition stands allowed in those terms.
