Petitioners Lovepreet Kaur and Kulwinder Singh have filed the present petition under Section 482 Cr.P.C. for issuance of directions to the official respondents for providing protection to their life and liberty on the ground that they have apprehension of threat from respondents No.4 and 5 (parents of petitioner No.1) as the petitioners have entered into alleged marriage against the wishes of the parents.

Learned counsel for the petitioners contends that the said marriage was performed on 09.4.2019 and on the same day a representation dated 09.4.2019 (Annexure P-5) was given to the Commissioner of Police, Ludhiana. The representation (Annexure P-5) does not reveals the factum of marriage as pleaded in the petition. It simply contains the fact that

applicants are willing to get married. The petition does not disclose any convincing source of threat muchless mode and manner of the alleged threat.

The pleadings, as contained in the petition, does not inspire confidence. Resultantly, no ground is made out for invoking inherent powers under Section 482 Cr.P.C. to issue directions of any kind to the official respondents.

The petition is hereby dismissed.
