The learned counsel contends that the petitioner was born and bred in UK and is NRI. She came in contact with respondent No.5 Inderpal Singh, who met her in the capacity of a religious guru and who represented that he serves and helps the poor and provides education to them. The petitioner being impressed and wanting to help poor opened a joined account with respondent No.5 and transferred huge amounts to the tune of ₹1.61 crores approximately but later on it transpired that respondent No.5 was infact a fraudster and had usurped the entire amount for his personal use.

The learned counsel has submitted that although complaint was submitted to Police Station, N.R.I. Wing, District Kapurthala but no action has been taken thereupon. It has been submitted that later on she was informed that her complaint had been filed and thereafter she lodged an e-complaint (Annexure P-8) on the official website of Police Station, N.R.I.

Wing, District Kapurthala on 19.3.2019, but till date no action has been taken thereupon.

Having heard the learned counsel for the petitioner, the petition is disposed of with a direction to respondent No.2-Senior Superintendent of Police, Kapurthala to look into the matter and to dispose of the representation (Annexure P-8), moved by petitioner expeditiously preferably within a period of six months from today in accordance with law.

A copy of this order alongwith representation (Annexure P-8) be sent to respondent No.2-Senior Superintendent of Police, Kapurthala so as to enable him to do the needful expeditiously.
