The present petition has been filed by the petitioner for directing official respondents No.2 and 3 for registration of FIR against respondents No.5 to 7 under Sections 420, 467, 468, 471 read with 120B IPC on the complaint Annexure P.19 submitted by the petitioner.

This Court has already held in another petition i.e. CRM-M-20457 of 2019 decided on 06.05.2019, that unless the statutory proceedings have already been initiated by statutory authority or Court under Code of Criminal Procedure (for short, "Cr.P.C"), the petition under Section 482 Cr.P.C is not maintainable for issuance of any direction. The remedy can be a writ petition under Article 226 of the Constitution of India.

In view of the above, the present petition is dismissed.

However, the petitioner would be at liberty to avail any other alternative remedy, in accordance with law.
