GURVINDER SINGH GILL, J. (ORAL)

1. The petitioner has approached this court seeking issuance of direction for protection of his life and liberty and also for a direction for compliance of Section 160 Cr.P.C.
2. Learned counsel for the petitioner has submitted that private respondents i.e. respondents No.5 to 8 are working as travel agents and that the petitioner had introduced one Yugraj Singh to the said private respondents as he wanted to go abroad, but somehow the private respondents could not secure Visa for Yugraj Singh. It has been submitted that now the police is unnecessarily harassing the petitioner although he has no role to play in the entire episode and

is not even a beneficiary.

3. Having heard learned counsel for the petitioner, the petition is disposed of with a direction to respondents No.2-Senior Superintendent of Police, Gurdaspur to ensure that if the petitioner is required to be associated with any inquiry or investigation or some information is to be elicited from him, then a written advance notice in terms of Section 160 of Criminal Procedure Code, 1973 be served upon him. It is made clear that the aforesaid directions will not confer any immunity upon the petitioner, in case it is found that he has committed any cognizable offence.
4. A copy of this order be sent to respondent No.2-Senior Superintendent of Police, Gurdaspur so as to enable him to do the needful expeditiously.
