Present petition has been filed under Section 482 Cr.P.C. for quashing of the order dated 03.10.2013, passed by learned Sub Divisional Judicial Magistrate, Nakodar, whereby the petitioner has been declared proclaimed offender in case FIR No. 352, dated 29.12.2012, under Sections 307, 324, 323, 427, 148 and 149 of the Indian Penal Code and Sections 25 & 27 of the Arms Act, registered at Police Station, Nakodar, District Jalandhar.

On 12.03.2019, the following order was passed by this Court:

“It is contended by learned counsel for the petitioner that the petitioner is ready to join the proceedings before learned trial Court in FIR No. 352 dated 29.12.2012, under Sections 307, 324, 323, 427, 148 and 149 of the Indian Penal Code and Sections 25 and 27 of the Arms Act, 1959 registered at Police Station Nakodar, District Jalandhar.

Adjourned to 07.05.2019.

In the meanwhile, the petitioner is directed to surrender before learned trial Court within two weeks and in case of his doing so, be admitted on interim bail till the next date of hearing on his furnishing adequate bail and surety bonds to its satisfaction. ”

It is contended by learned counsel for the petitioner that in terms of the order dated 12.03.2019, the petitioner has surrendered before learned trial Court. Further contended that the petitioner is regularly appearing before learned trial Court.

On instructions from ASI Surjit Singh, the above factual position is duly acknowledged by learned State counsel.

In view of the above, the order dated 12.03.2019 is made absolute.

Petition stands disposed off.

However, it is clarified that the petitioner shall not seek any unnecessary adjournment before learned trial Court and shall fully co-operate in the proceedings.
