By filing the present petition under Section 438 of the Code of Criminal Procedure, the petitioner has sought anticipatory bail in FIR No.1111 dated 27.09.2017, under Sections 420, 427, 452, 457, 458, 459, 471 and 506 of the Indian Penal Code ('IPC' – for short), registered at Police Station City Ballabgarh, District Faridabad.

On 16.11.2018, this Court had passed the following order:-

“Learned counsel for the petitioner contends that notice in the matter was issued on 14.9.2018 and the case of the complainant as well as petitioner is based on documentary material.

Adjourned to 19.12.2018.

Meanwhile, the petitioner shall join the investigation and would come present as and when

called for and in the event of arrest, the petitioner shall be admitted to interim bail on her furnishing personal and surety bonds to the satisfaction of Arresting/Investigating Officer. The petitioner shall also abide by the conditions as specified under Section 438(2) Cr.P.C.

To be heard along with CRM-M-31651-2018.”

Learned counsel for the petitioner contends that in pursuance of the order dated 16.11.2018, the petitioner has joined the investigation.

Learned State counsel on instructions from ASI Pritam submits that the petitioner has joined the investigation and she is not required for custodial interrogation.

In view of the above, without expressing any opinion on the merits of the case, the interim bail granted by this Court vide order dated 16.11.2018, is made absolute.

The petition stands allowed.
