ANUPINDER SINGH GREWAL, J (ORAL)

The petitioner is seeking anticipatory bail in FIR No.68 dated 23.03.2019, under Sections 406, 420 and 120-B of the Indian Penal Code ('IPC' - for short), registered at Police Station Kotwali, District Patiala.

Learned counsel for the petitioner contends that he had already paid a sum of ₹5.00 lacs to the complainant on the last date of hearing and today he has brought a demand draft for a sum of ₹6.00 lacs in favour of the complainant, which has been handed over to learned counsel for the complainant. He also states that the effort shall be made to settle the matter.

This Court, by the order dated 22.08.2019, had directed the petitioner to appear before the Investigating Officer and join the investigation and in the event of her arrest, she was ordered to be released on ad-interim bail to the satisfaction of the Investigating/Arresting Officer, subject to the conditions envisaged under Section 438(2) Cr.P.C.

Learned State counsel, on instructions from ASI Sher Singh, states that the petitioner has joined investigation and is not required for custodial interrogation.

In view of the submissions of learned counsel for the petitioner and the petitioner having joined investigation, the order dated 22.08.2019 granting interim bail to the petitioner is made absolute.

However, the petitioner shall abide by the conditions stipulated under Section 438(2) Cr.P.C. She shall also join investigation as and when called upon to do so.

The petition stands disposed of.
