FATEH DEEP SINGH, J. (ORAL)

Report dated 01.11.2018 of learned Judicial Magistrate 1st

Class, Patiala has been received whereby after recording statements of complainant Seema Rani alias Baljinder Kaur and the accused persons, namely, Jasdev Singh, Ram Murti and Karamjit Kaur as well as that of the investigating officer, the Court has shown its satisfaction that the compromise has been arrived at voluntarily, out of free will of the parties, without any undue influence, coercion or pressure.

Moreover, during the course of interaction with the parties,
they have shown their resolve to end the dispute and have made

statements that they have compromised the matter as per compromise (Annexure P2) dated 24.07.2018 and shall abide by the same.

Heard.

In the light of the satisfaction shown by the Court and the fact that the dispute between the parties being a pure matrimonial and the offenses for which the accused have been hauled up are not of serious nature, together with the fact that compromise will go a long way in ironing out differences for betterment of future life of the parties and in view of the law laid down in '**Gian Singh v. State of Punjab and another**' 2012(4) RCR (Criminal) 543 and '**Kulwinder Singh and others v. State of Punjab and another**' 2007 (3) RCR (Criminal) 1052, the prayer made in the petition is allowed, proceedings by way of FIR No.24 dated 15.06.2018 under Section 498-A IPC pertaining to Police Station Women Cell, District Patiala and all consequences arising out of the said FIR qua the petitioners are quashed.

The petition stands allowed in those terms.
