Petitioners have filed the presnet petition under Section 482 Cr.P.C. for issuance of directions to the official respondents to protect their life and liberty from the hands of respondents No.4 to 6 (parents and brother respectively of petitioner No.1), as they have entered into marriage on 16.4.2018 against the wishes of private respondents.

Learned counsel for the petitioners contends that after the alleged marriage a phone call was made by respondent No.4 to his daughter thereby extending threat as he was against the marriage entered into between the petitioners. The photographs appended with the petition do not indicate the solemnization of marriage as alleged by the parties. Besides, a perusal of the representation dated 16.4.2019 (Annexure P-5) addressed to

the Senior Superintendent of Police, Faridkot does not indicate the alleged threat of phone call by father to petitioner No.1. As per the representation, the private respondents allegedly, alongwith 4-5 persons entered in the house of in-laws of petitioner No.1 and gave beatings to them. There is nothing to indicate that any injury was suffered or any complaint in that regard was made to the police by in-law of petitioner No.1.

The contents of the petition and the representation (Annexure P-5) are vague and do not inspire confidence. Resultantly, no ground is made out for invoking inherent powers under Section 482 Cr.P.C.

The petition is hereby dismissed.
