FATEH DEEP SINGH, J.

At the very onset, learned counsel for the petitioners on instructions from his client has made statement withdrawing the present petition on behalf of petitioner No.1.

Allowed to do so. The petition stands dismissed as withdrawn qua petitioner No.1-Gagandeep Singh.

Report dated 13.11.2018 of learned Sub Divisional Judicial Magistrate, Balachaur has been received whereby after recording statements of complainant Amanpreet Kaur and the accused petitioner No.2, namely, Navdeep Singh the Court has shown its satisfaction that the compromise has been arrived at voluntarily, out of free will of the parties, without any undue influence, coercion or pressure.

Moreover, during the course of interaction with petitioner No.2 and the complainant private respondent No.2, they have shown their resolve to end the dispute and have made statements that they have compromised the matter as per compromise (Annexure P3) dated 22.07.2017 and shall abide by the same.

Heard.

In the light of the satisfaction shown by the Court and the fact that the dispute between the parties being a pure matrimonial and the offenses for which the accused has been hauled up are not of serious nature, together with the fact that compromise will go a long way in ironing out differences for betterment of future life of the parties and in view of the law laid down in '**Gian Singh v. State of Punjab and another**' 2012(4) RCR (Criminal) 543 and '**Kulwinder Singh and others v. State of Punjab and another**' 2007 (3) RCR (Criminal) 1052, the prayer made in the petition is allowed, proceedings by way of FIR No.0006 dated 05.01.2017 under Section 498-A IPC pertaining to Police Station Balachour, District SBS Nagar and all consequences arising out of the said FIR in respect of petitioner No.2-Navdeep Singh are hereby quashed.

The petition stands disposed off in those terms.
